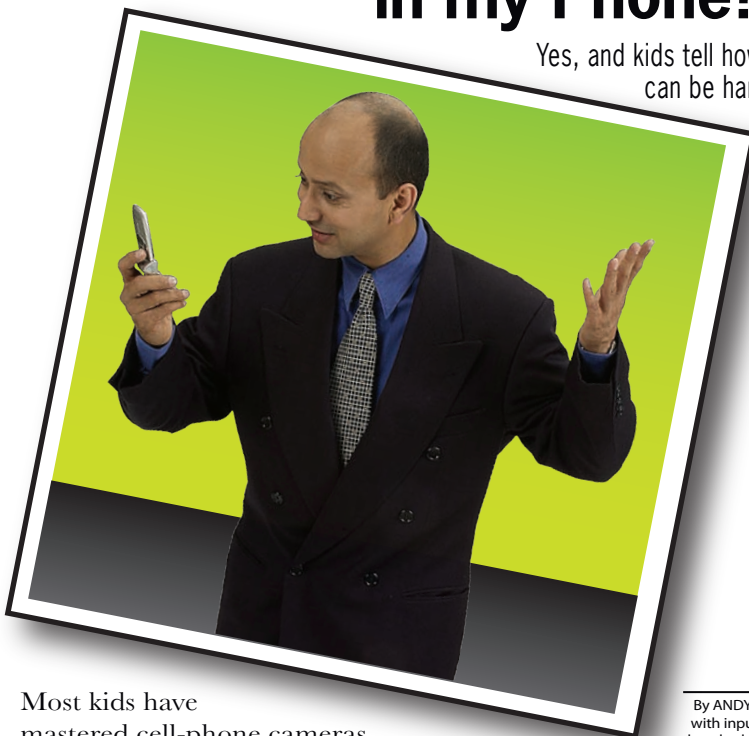


What? There's a Camera in my Phone?!
